Four pillars, achievable in three years

01 Proximity Management

Empower each member locally and cover the territory.

02 Defence of the Architect's Title

Curb illegal practices, bogus signatures, and underpayment through well-thought-out strategies that have been discussed and submitted to the Board for approval at the General Meeting.

03 Experience Sharing

Support and mentor, in order to prepare the future of the profession.

04 Promotion of Architectural Works in the Territory

Advocate for showcasing projects and works completed by architects in general and those from the Littoral and South-West regions in particular.

Three years, **three phases**

Year 1 2026 – 2027

Know and structure

- Set up and make contact in the two regions.
- Establish and submit the regional census to the General Secretariat.
- Create five proximity hubs: Douala, Nkongsamba, Edea, Limbe, Kumba.
- Open a monthly drop-in session; maintain an active bilingual liaison channel.
- Feed regional needs into the budget cycle before September 30, the only available window under article 73.
- Create or strengthen a consultation framework with local authorities in both regions.

Year 2 2027 – 2028

Deploy

- Create or strengthen a consultation framework with local authorities in both regions.
- Organize a campaign in both regions for public and private project owners on the mandatory use of an architect.
- Publish the regional register of opportunities and public contracts.
- Organize two mentoring sessions.
- Hold the first exhibition of regional architectural works during the Urbanism Days.
- Run an insurance compliance campaign before the March 31 deadline.
- Hold two continuing education sessions.

Year 3 2028 – 2029

Consolidate and transmit

- Organize two mentoring sessions.
- Hold one continuing education session.
- Publish the catalogue of works and submit the format to the Council.
- Propose a regional distinction to the Council.
- Conduct a local evaluation of the three years before colleagues.
- Integrate the achievements into the ordinary functioning of the Order.
- Submit regional archives and files to the General Secretary (article 65).
